SUMMARY: This letter provides information that supplements the 2025–2026 award year verification information provided in the Federal Register notice published on September 4, 2024.

Dear Colleague:

On September 4, 2024, we published a Federal Register notice 89 FR 71893 🔀 announcing the 2025–2026 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®) verification items for applicants selected by the Department as well as the acceptable documentation for those items.

This Dear Colleague Letter (DCL) summarizes and explains the changes in the verification process for the 2025–2026 award year. Additionally, at the end of this DCL, we have provided suggested text that an institution may use to fulfill its regulatory verification requirements.

Changes for the 2025–2026 Award Year

Applications are selected to ensure:

- Accuracy
- Validity
- Equity

Required Data for Selected Applicants

Changes

 No changes IF FTI was successfully transferred

IRS Identity

- TRDBV no longer needed
- Submit signed 2023 tax return transcript
- IRS 4674C or signed and dated statement


Confined or Incarcerated

- VI not required to be verified
- V4 Statement of Educational Purpose still required
- V5 only the Statement of Education Purpose still required

Verification Text

- Suggestions only
- Statement of Educational Purpose

Verification Selection



- Selection by:
 - FAFSA processing (FPS)
 - School
- U.S. Department of Education (ED) uses a customized approach
- May be information not used in SAI calculation

Conflicting Information

- Must be resolved for all award years, even prior ones
- Beyond verification requirements, conflicting information does not need to be resolved if:
 - Does not affect student's student aid index (SAI) or Title IV eligibility
 - Student dies during award year; or
 - Conflicting data are received after student is no longer enrolled and does not intend to re-enroll at the school
- Includes correcting nondollar items, whether result of verification or resolution of conflicting information
- School decides appropriate documentation

Documentation

- Successful IRS transfer on FTI
- Must complete verification using actual filed tax return data unless the individual has IRS-approved tax filing extension
- Specified year is prior-prior year (PPY)
 - For 2025-2026, specified year is 2023



Statement of Educational Purpose



- Must be presented in person at the same time to school-designated official or to notary
- Confined or incarcerated students:
 - Signed statement from an authorized official who works for the correction facility or the oversight entity confirming to the school that the individual who completed the FAFSA form was selected for verification and is the person signing the form.

Corrections

- All incorrect verification data must be corrected
- If eligible for subsidized (e.g., Pell, Loan, FSEOG) only the following corrections must be sent to FPS for reprocessing:
 - Any single dollar item change of \$25 or more
 - Any nondollar verification item change (e.g., family size)

Updates

- Dependency status must be updated throughout award year
- Family size must be updated at time of verification

Adjustments

- Discretion granted to FAAs under section 479A(a) of Higher Education Act of 1965 (HEA), as amended
- Case-by-case basis due to documented special or unusual circumstance
- Cannot have a policy to deny all PJ requests and must consider all such requests
